Note: A sample of questions is being provided for making the candidates aware of the style and difficulty level of the questions which have been asked in the past. The sections composition, the type of questions and the areas from which the questions have been asked in the past have varied largely. The topics covered here in the sample is not a true indication of the syllabus and the test may contain questions from all related areas under different sections. The samples are given primarily to help the candidates understand the pattern of the test.

Compact discs (CD) have revolutionised the music industry with their surprisingly realistic sound. The six-inch discs look like thin plastic sandwiches with aluminium at the centre. CDs are also virtually indestructible, and they are lighter and smaller than conventional records. Since their introduction, CDs have become more affordable and widely available. 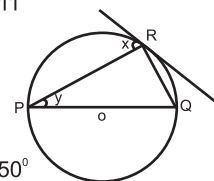
